Masonic History Part 1

We all know the beginnings of our Masonic history and King Solomon's Temple with Brother Hiram from our search for more light in Masonry though the stories and adventures we were taught during Masonic ceremonies. But where do we see the roots of organized Masonic beginnings for us here today? The Masonic History series will come up on some newsletters as a way to share some of that history and let us be proud of our strong background as F&AM.

As early as I can start with documented history...

The oldest document that makes reference to Masons is the <u>Regius Poem—A Poem of Moral Duties</u> which was printed in about 1390. The poem manuscript is in rhymed verse and consists of 794 lines. At the head of the poem is written "Hie incipient constituciones artis gemetriae secondum Euclydem." or "Here begins the constitutions of the art of Geometry according to Euclid." (full translation) <u>https://freemasonry.bcy.ca/texts/regius.html</u> This poem is an account of a man and the basic story and foundations of F&AM from the time of creation of Masonic craft and the intent/design of Masonic principles.

Moving forward In 1717, four Masonic lodges in London formed the first Grand Lodge of England, and from that point on there is a better recorded history along with a lot of stories of history along the way.

Within 30 years from the creation of the first Grand Lodge of England, the Masonic fraternity had spread through Europe and to the American Colonies. Where we shall continue next time.
